Bampton Belles WI

I wonder how many people now living in Bampton are aware that our Village Hall in the Market Square was once the WI hall. Sadly, with declining numbers due to various factors such as age and people moving away, and the building needing maintenance the WI ceased. The hall was taken over by the Parish Council and is now a well-used building at the centre of village life.

The Bampton Belles WI was formed in July 2019 after the Oxfordshire WI Federation began to look at the possibility of creating a new WI in the village. As this was a new

branch of WI, volunteers were required to form a committee to ensure the effective coordination and administration of the Bampton Belles. Throughout the rest of 2019, members enjoyed talks from interesting speakers and the pleasure of demonstrations such as National Trust gardening, antiques and wreath making, followed by a Christmas party. The Bampton Belles continued to meet in the Bampton Pavilion until the first National Lockdown in March 2020.

Even though the current situation has prompted all WIs to cease monthly meetings with members, the Bampton Belles committee continues to remain proactive, having a monthly committee meeting via zoom to plan future meetings and ways to keep our members engaged until our group meetings can resume. The most recent being a small Christmas parcel, a questionnaire and newsletter updates.

VACCINATION STORY

FROM JULIE ANN GODSON

On 7 January 1886, Joseph Hiatt of Hook Norton was brought before the magistrates for failing to have his 2-year-old daughter Annie vaccinated against smallpox. A comfortable High Street draper and outfitter, Hiatt was represented by his solicitor who informed the magistrates that Mr Hiatt was a conscientious objector against vaccination, and was unlikely to change his mind.

The Bench made an order for Annie to be vaccinated within 14 days. Most resistance against vaccination was a reaction to its compulsory nature than to the vaccination itself. It was in this context that the phrase "conscientious objector" first came into common parlance. Once compulsion was withdrawn resistance dwindled, and smallpox was eventually eradicated in the 1970s. That's... er... 90 years...

'ON THIS DAY IN OXFORDSHIRE'

"On 23 February 1811, an inquest took place on the body of a well-dressed man who had been found drowned. The local paper reported: "He appeared to be about 40 years of age, was decently dressed, and had on a brown coat with a black velvet collar, yellow swansdown waistcoat spotted with black, cordurov breeches, red vellow and handkerchief round his neck, and a blue woollen apron round his waist. In his coat pockets two or three handfuls of flock, and in his waistcoat pocket two Bank of England one pound notes, and one Wootton Basset one pound note, and a few halfpence; but nothing else was found to assist in tracing out who he was or from whence he came." Taken together, the samples of flock (wool) and the blue apron may denote the man's occupation as a weaver. The pound note




from Wootton Bassett is a reminder that, until the mid-19th century, commercial banks were able to issue their own banknotes, and notes issued by provincial banking companies were the common form of currency outside London. The mystery gentleman was buried at Bampton church two days after the inquest."

If you have lived in or around Bampton for some time you will probably know about West Ox Arts, but if you are new to the area you may wonder what that big building is, in the middle of the town, opposite the Co-op. It looks

like a Town Hall and was in fact built for that purpose, opening in 1838. Since then it has had several uses including a spell as the local fire station, with space for the fire engines downstairs.

For nearly 50 years the upstairs has housed West Ox Arts, a local art society dedicated to promoting art in West Oxfordshire. We hold regular exhibitions and if you were allowed in now you would see our latest show – a Members Exhibition, which includes paintings, ceramics, textiles and glass, all produced by members of the society, most of them from the local area. We put this up in the autumn and had hoped to open again after Christmas, but of course the lockdown rules prevent this. Everything is frozen in



time – our excellent staff are furloughed, our many volunteers are having a well earned rest, and all the exhibits are sitting there unappreciated.

99 SQUADRON CARRY OUT RUNWAY OPERATIONS TRAINING IN LOUISIANA USA

99 Squadron took the next step in developing the aircraft's Semi Prepared Runway Operations (SPRO) capability during training based in Louisiana, USA. During this training, the entire crew experienced first-hand the complexities of operating in this type of environment and learnt how best to prepare both aircraft and personnel to deliver safely, when called upon.

SPRO is a latent capability of the C-17, which involves operating from runways constructed from non-permanent materials,





such as gravel, dirt or even packed ice and snow. Normally, aircraft of the C-17's size would require much longer, wider and smoother surfaces to operate from, but the C-17 was designed with this kind of capability in mind. Developing a UK C-17 SPRO capability allows the RAF to exploit the existing capability of the C-17, opening up a new area of operation for Defence now and for the futur(e.


