25. Tuesday: Finished on Air Ministry.

27. Thursday: Started on Council.

May 29. Monday: WHIT MONDAY. Morris dancers at Bampton.

30. Tuesday: Mew Morris Team. Start practise.

June 10. Saturday: Morris dancers go to Alvescott.

24. Saturday: Morris dancers at Aston.

July 8. Saturday: Morris dancers at Ebrington - Good.

15. Saturday: Morris dancers at Witney (crossed out)

Aug 6. Sunday: Morris Dancers at Stratford

7. Monday : BANK HOLIDAY. Morris Dancers at Stratford on

Avon.
