
Council funding and spending 2020/21

What we spend on council services

The figures below show how we plan to spend our £640.2m gross expenditure budget (excluding schools) on services compared to £600.3m in 2019/20. We spend £188.7m on running schools, which comes directly from government.



- The government allows councils to raise a 2% adult social care precept to help relieve funding pressures
- Council tax requirement is £391.5m in 2020/21 (£369.1m in 2019/20)
- (Council tax increase for 2019/20 was 2.99%)

Capital Programme

Our £1.1bn capital programme includes investment in highway improvements, new school buildings and energy efficient street lighting over 10 years. This money can only be used for the purpose it has been given and cannot be allocated to day-to-day council spending.
