

THE HISTORY OF THE CELEBRATION OF MASS IN THE PARISH OF BAMPTON, OXFORDSHIRE



St Mary's Church, Bampton

There is mention of a Mass being said in Bampton in the midnineteenth century. It was celebrated by a Maltese priest, the Reverend Frances Guaci Azzopardi from Buckland, who travelled to Bampton Castle on alternate Sundays during the year 1856-57, to say Mass in a chapel over the gatehouse. Nothing more of this is known, except that it ceased after a year; but there must have been a Catholic community living in Bampton at that time.

Eighty years later, in the 1930s, the Eagle pub in Church View was run by the Catholic Mr and Mrs Martin. Father Lopes, then the newly-appointed parish priest of Eynsham, used to come to say Mass on Sunday mornings in a room above the pub, and after 1938 this service was taken over by the parish priest from Carterton. The Martins charged the parish £3.00 every quarter as rent for the use of their room. The rent came from the money made from the annual Jumble Sale.

When the Martins retired, in 1960, there was an opportunity to buy land for a Catholic chapel in Queen Street for £375.00, but planning permission was refused. Instead Mass was celebrated every Sunday in a room above the Fire Station in the Town Hall.

In 1964 the room upstairs in the Town Hall became unavailable, and the Mass centre had to find a new home. The Catholic congregation was offered the use of a room at the former Grammar School for Mass on Sundays at a rent of £30 a year. The rent came from the money made at the annual Jumble Sale in the W.I. Hall.


Early in 1968, Father Lees asked for permission to say Mass during the week at Haytor, in Lavender Square, the home of Major and Mrs Phillips; but this came to nothing as the Phillips family moved away for a few years.

By 1974 the room in the Grammar School was becoming too small for the growing Catholic congregation; and it was then that nine-year-old Monica Phillips, as she walked to Mass one Sunday, remarked to Reg Rouse, a member of the choir at St Mary's, that the Anglicans had a big church while the Catholics only had a small room.

As a result, after many months of negotiation between the Church authorities, the Catholic congregation was invited to make use of St Mary's Church for Mass on Sundays. No fee was asked, but the money from the annual Jumble Sale was then given to St Mary's Church as a contribution to the heating.

A happy and successful ecumenical relationship has been fostered over the years; and since the closure of the Convent at Fernham and the Catholic Church in Buckland, the congregation has grown in size.

A celebration of the forty years of this ecumenical collaboration is to be held in June 2016.
