An Agreement entered into this 10th day of October, 1908, between J. A. James, in the County of ~~Bampton~~ ^{Gloucester} Farmer (hereinafter called the MASTER) of the one part, and Albert Edgington, of ~~Bampton~~ ^{Gloucester}, in the County of ~~Gloucester~~ ^{Gloucester}, Labourer (hereinafter called the SERVANT) of the other part, WHEREBY the said SERVANT agrees to serve his said MASTER as a ~~cowman~~ ^{cowman} and also as a general servant in husbandry from the 11th day of October 1908, to the 11th day of October 1909, at a Weekly Wages of 14. payable weekly.

To have 6^d per day beer money when at hay & harvest cart & 3^d an hour over time after 5-30. p. m. Cottage & garden free.

payable weekly, and the sum of £ extra for harvest.

AND the said MASTER hereby agrees to find the said SERVANT employment as aforesaid, and to pay him the wages before-mentioned, subject to the following conditions:

PROVIDED that if the said SERVANT should be disabled by sickness from following his usual employment, then the weekly wages shall cease to be payable during the period of such disability, and the said SERVANT shall not be entitled to any portion of the said sum of £ in case he shall be discharged for misconduct, or shall enlist, or shall join the Militia without his MASTER'S consent, or otherwise leave his MASTER'S employ before the expiration of the service under this Agreement.
