

### FREE PARKING AT RISK IN WEST OXFORDSHIRE

The Liberal-led coalition at Oxfordshire County Council are looking to impose parking charges in West Oxfordshire. For years, the Conservative's popular free parking policy has been key to thriving high streets in our market towns.

During the COVID pandemic local businesses have been impacted by a drop in trade. The free parking in West Oxfordshire, thanks to Conservative-led West Oxfordshire District Council, has been an important lifeline, helping to support our High Streets.

The Lib Dem, Labour and Green coalition at County Hall have recently just increased parking charges at some locations in Oxford City. These will rise over 200%.


### What's at stake at this election

Voters face increased costs with the Lib Dems. who have shown themselves to be out of touch with West Oxfordshire residents.

The Liberal-Labour-Green coalition at Oxfordshire County Council is increasing your Council Tax this year despite increased funding from central government. Conversely, the Conservative-led District Council in West Oxfordshire is keeping its Council Tax charges as low as possible whilst retaining highly regarded local services and facilities.

Conservative councillors will continue to stand up for our area, ensuring West Oxfordshire is a greener, more pleasant place. Conservative-run West Oxfordshire District Council has pledged to become a carbonneutral council by 2030 - a historic target which shows that Conservatives in this district are leading the way on climate change.

### **Action For Clean Rivers**

Local Conservative Councillors have supported Witney & West Oxfordshire MP, Robert Courts, in his backing of stronger laws to tackle pollution in our rivers.

The recently-passed Environment Act puts in place more protections against water pollution than ever before, including a new legal duty on water companies to tackle sewage overflows.

The Act also places a new duty directly on water companies to publish near real time information - within one hour - on the operation of storm overflows. This already appears to be bearing fruit, with the Environment Agency recently announcing a major investigation into water companies for alleged illegal sewage spills.

Robert is working closely with local Conservative councillors to hold Thames Water to account locally, highlighting sewage spills and demanding infrastructure upgrades throughout West Oxfordshire. This has achieved success in areas such as Clanfield, with Thames Water recently delivering muchneeded repair and upgrade works.

They continue to press for the urgent delivery of the planned expansion of Witney Sewage Treatment Works which will significantly increase capacity at the site to reduce storm overflows.

Conservative councillors will continue to support all efforts - locally and nationally - to reduce sewage pollution and protect the health of our rivers





### Lib Dems fail to deal with Community Concerns

Rather than addressing the concerns of local residents, the Lib Dems and their coalition partners at Oxfordshire County Council have made national headlines by banning meat from Council events.

While residents want action on potholes and local transport improvements, the Liberals running the County Council are more concerned with vilifying local farmers and pushing their own agenda at the expense of personal choice.

# Supporting Witney High Street

Independent traders give our High Streets their unique character and are the lifeblood of our local economy. Local Conservatives are standing up for them and supporting a bustling Witney High Street.

Instead of listening to local traders, the new Liberal/Labour/ Green coalition in County Hall have ignored their concerns and implemented a permanent ban on motor vehicles in Witney High Street, despite having no long-term plan for Witney's centre.

The County Council's cavalier approach has led to traffic chaos on surrounding roads such as Corn Street and Welch Way, a struggling High Street, and traders reporting a significant downturn in business. After a difficult couple of years due to the pandemic, local Conservatives believe the Liberal-led Council's dismissive attitude to local businesses is unacceptable.

That is why local MP, Robert Courts, has joined with Witney's Conservative District Councillors to call on the Liberal-led County Council to start listening to the concerns of local residents. We need a full and proper consultation so that Witney residents can have our say on the long-term future of our wonderful town and ensure its High Street is a success.

# Helping local speedwatch initiative

**Bampton Community Speedwatch was set** up in September 2021 to raise awareness of the issues around speeding in the village of Bampton and it is supported by Thames Valley Police.

Rupert Dent has been very happy to help the local speedwatch group by volunteering his time.

It has been reported that on seeing volunteers drivers tend to slow down, which in itself helps to keep everyone safe on the road.

Generally the group has been welcomed by locals and has the support of many drivers. Reducing speeding is important because: hitting a child at 40mph results in a 90% chance of death. At 35mph it is 50%, 30mph 20% - but at 20mph just 2.5%.

Working together Rupert and Ted will report roads for repair, help reduce speeding and make roads safer for all.

### **Provision of** new litter bins

Rupert Dent has worked with West Oxfordshire District Council in reviewing its provision of litter bins across the district to make it much easier for residents and visitors to dispose of their rubbish responsibly, helping to keep communities litter free.

At the same time, the Council is investing in new litter bins so that older bins, which are reaching the end of their useful life, can be swapped out for bins that are easier to empty and more visually pleasing to help keep our villages looking their best.

- Where an existing litterbin is next to a dog waste bin, the dog waste bin may be removed as bagged dog waste is now accepted in with the general litter.
- Where two bins are close to each other and where usage is low, one of the bins may be moved to another location where there is evidence of litter and where there is no bin.
- Residents will start to see a phasing out of separate litter and dog waste bins. These will be replaced by a brand new single bin, which asks people to put litter and dog waste into the bin. Over a hundred of the new style bins are already in use in the district and proving popular.

Currently, the Council manages and empties over 1,200 litter and dog waste bins. The programme to check the condition of all existing bins is ongoing and it is important to make sure they are located where they will provide most benefit. Also, litter bins will be put in new locations as needed.
