

Philemon and Baucis lead a simple but contented pastoral life, devoted to each other – but can they withstand the devastating appearance of mighty Jupiter, whose moodiness could well presage unexpected severe weather? How will Paris, a lowly shepherd, manage to choose between the rival beauties, Pallas Athena, Juno and Venus, and so award the glittering prize of the golden apple? Fasten your seat-belts for a supersonic ride to Mount Olympus, as the gods intervene in the lives of mortals!

Bampton Classical Opera, now in its 24th season, enjoys a national reputation for its passionate and enlightened discovery of the byways of eighteenth-century opera. Working with some of the finest emerging young professional singers, Bampton always delights with its superb ensembles and entertaining productions. After his much-praised interpretation of Salieri's *Trofonio's Cave* in 2015, the exciting young conductor Paul Wingfield, a graduate of the Royal Opera's Jette Parker Young Artist Programme, returns to work with director Jeremy Gray in what will be a quirky and irreverent take on classical mythology.
