AGREEMENT FOR MAINTENANCE OF
WAR GRAVES OF THE 1914/18 AND 1939/45 WARS

IN BAMPTON CEMETERY,
OXFORDSHIRE.

Sir,

In consideration of the payment of £2. 5. Od. payable annually in arrears, or a proportionate payment for any period less than a year, the **Mr. G. Govier.** offers to maintain in good order the War Graves (identified as stated below/~~as per attached schedule~~) in the above named burial place and not now maintained by the relatives, which offer includes the following services :—

- (a) the keeping of the War Graves clear of all weeds, stones, loose soil and rubbish, the mowing of the grass from time to time as occasion requires, the filling up, levelling and re-turfing of all holes and bare places in the turf ;
- (b) the washing of the Commission headstones as and when necessary but not less than once in each year by scrubbing with a brush and clean water only.

The Agreement may be terminated by either side by giving to the other one month's previous notice in writing.
