



We had a competition where an author, Dick King-Smith came in to judge our Short Story and Model Competition, he writes childrens books about animals such as the "Sheep-pig".



Mr. Dick King-Smith commented that all the work submitted was exceptionally good and he had a hard time judging it. Well done everyone!




