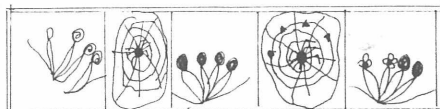

Yenworthy

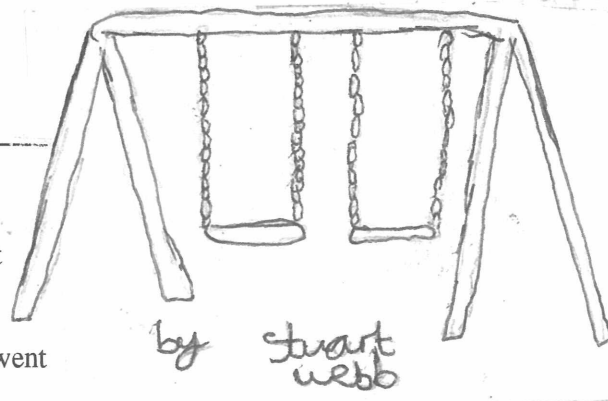

Emily Glyde first and Amy Mills second.

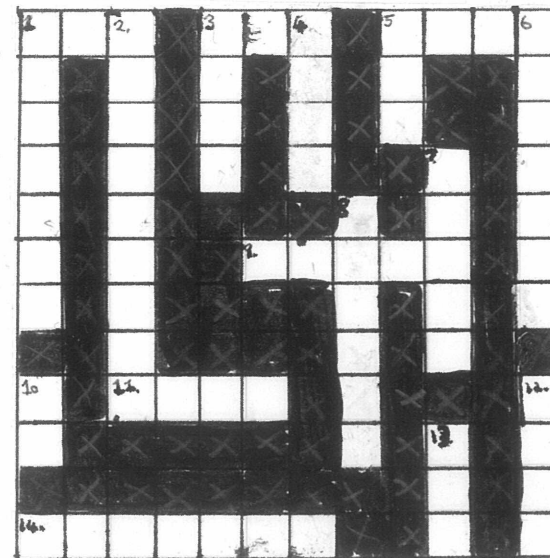
Mr. Dick King-Smith commented that all the work submitted was exceptionally good and he had a hard time judging it.

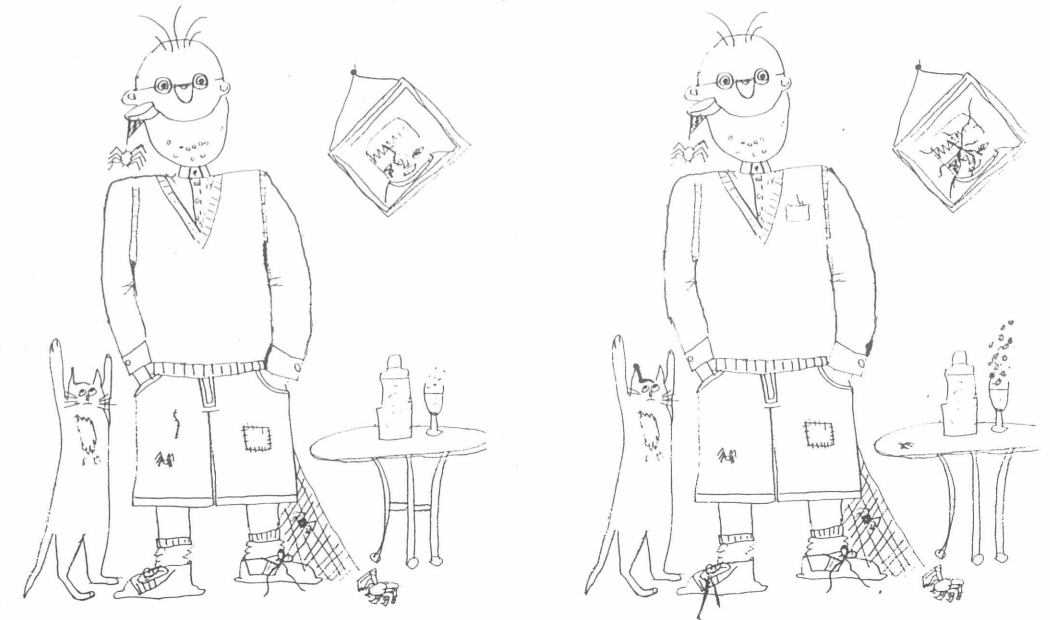
