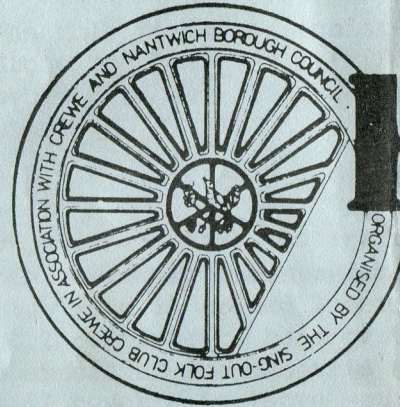

There will be a mobile caterer on the camp-site providing breakfasts on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

The Friery Cafe on Market Street, will be open from 8.30 am on Saturday, and on Sunday (depending on demand).

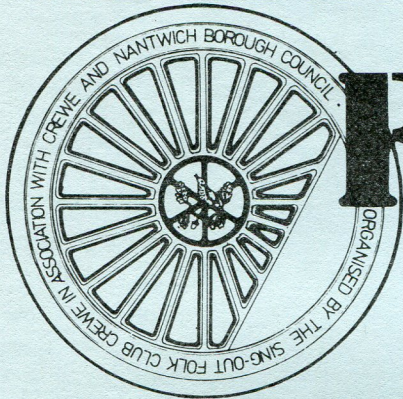
