# THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW

Sidmouth lies between Exmouth and Lyme Regis. M4 from North, M5 from Birmingham or Bristol. Leave M5 at Cullompton, Junction 28, then A373 via Honiton to Sidmouth. No trains run to Sidmouth - Bus from Honiton or Exeter.

SEASON TICKETS We regret that all adult seasons are sold. Season ticket admits to all events, but only provided there is room. We cannot guarantee admission, so get there early. ALWAYS SHOW YOUR SEASON - IF LOST THERE IS NO REPLACEMENT. Do not let anyone else use it. This particularly applies to those in costume. Stewards please note - a stewards badge does not give admission without a season ticket.

CHILDREN Seasons are available for 3 - 16 year olds - £9.00. Admits to all events except Late Night Extra and licensed events (unless performing).

CAMPING Only available to season ticket holders with permits. If you already have a season tikeet without camping, permits are available for Third Site only -£10.00, Children £1.00. Bring own equipment. Flush toilets and cold water available on all sites. Caravans are not allowed on Festival Sites but motor caravans are allowed.

MAIN SITE beyond disused station on Ottery St Mary road. FAMILY SITE at Fortescue on Sid Road (Seaton and Lyme Regis road from Sidmouth) THIRD SITE at Salcombe Regis is an overlow site. If your ticket is marked THIRD SITE you must camp here. Your friends from other sites may join you but you cannot join them.

SHOWERS are available for season ticket holders at Sidmouth Rugby Club. Sunday 1st - Friday 6th August. Women 9-10am and 5-6pm. Men 10-11am and 6-7pm. Price 20p.

FIRE PRECAUTIONS on all sites. There are fire points but for your own safety bring a bucket to fill with water and leave outside your tent in case of fire.

CAR PARKING For season ticket holders only. Collect your permit with season. Attach to left hand side of windscreen. This will admit you to the public Ham Car Park free of charge from 7pm - 9am and to Late Night Extra and Camp Sites.

Permits do not admit to any of the Council Car Parks except as above, or to the Arena. Only authorised Staff cars are allowed to park on the Arena or the grass around the Ham Marquee. Use the buses. There is a free Council Car Park at the Arena available at evening performances. Cars must be removed within 30 minutes of the end of the performance.

No guarantee is given by the English Folk Dance and Song Society or the East Devon District Council that parking space will be available anywhere. Car permits are only unlimited because there is plenty of space at Late Night Extra and Camp Sites.

BUS SERVICE Main Site. Times are not guaranteed but every effort will be made to keep to them. Single fare 15p. Can be stopped anywhere by season ticket holders but please use common sense in regard to traffic conditions.

Leave Port Royal: 9.30am, 10.15, 11.15, 12.15, 12.45, 2.30, 3.00, 4.15, 5.00, 5.30, 7.30, 8.00, 10.00, 10.30, 11.00pm.

MINIBUS SERVICE Family and Third Sites. Service will run as demand requires between sites and Port Royal. Timetables available from the driver or Information. Minibus will also operate from Late Night Extra to Family and Third Sites as required but check with driver in advance. When Port Royal is in use for Procession Assembly the minibus will depart from the Ham.

CONCERTS Season Ticket Holders can reserve seats as long as they are available, but for reservations the full price must be paid (except for Sunday at the Manor Pavilion). There is generally room to sit on the floor, stand, or for your own folding chair, so "all tickets gone" does not necessarily mean season ticket holders cannot attend (except for Manor Pavilion - see Working Programme). Priority will be given to Season Ticket Holders at Assembly Room Concerts until 7.55pm, after which the public will be given the chance to pay. (Only 50 tickets have been offered for sale in advance to each concert.)

SONG SESSIONS "Come All Ye" means special provision is to be made for floor singers and comperes have instructions not to include other booked guests. This has always been a feature of Sidmouth and we wish to see it continue.

LATE NIGHT EXTRA Limited to SEASON TICKET HOLDERS ONLY. Money cannot get you in without one. Please look at map for situation. Note exit and entrance — we operate our own oneway system. Those with cars are asked to help those without. LIMITED SPACE ON BUS FOR SEASON TICKET HOLDERS LEAVING PORT ROYAL AT 10.30 and

Please note, Greenway Lane is no longer a short cut to Late Night Extra as the road is closed halfway up. Please don't waste time trying as it annoys the residents.

Season Tickets must be shown at the Marquee entrance, where they will be clipped. The Director reserves the right to have the minority whose behaviour interferes with the enjoyment of the majority removed.

ARENA Season Ticket Holders can reserve seats on payment of the appropriate "seat only" price. Season only gives admission to the ground.

WET WEATHER In the event of wet weather, the Arena Display may take place in the Arena Marquee in which case priority will be given to stand and deck chair ticket holders and season ticket holders. Hobby Horse Club will be transferred to Lower Methodist Hall except on Sunday when it will be held in the Drill Hall.

Watch Newspaper for extra events to relieve pressure on halls and please remember we are doing our best. NO BAD TEMPERS PLEASE!

NEWSPAPER is published every morning (price 15p from the Folk Shop, Information or camp site stewards - team leaders and heads of departments free.) Any alterations to the programme and display and procession orders are published in the Newspaper as well as news items. It is important that everyone, especially stewards and performers should read it. All copy for Newspaper must be handed in to Information by 6pm the day before.

DOGS are permitted on camp sites provided they are kept on a lead at all times. Please exercise them away from campsites. Any fouling of camp sites will be dealt with severely. Dogs are not allowed on the Arena by order of East Devon District Council. At other events they are admitted at the discretion of the stewards.

STEWARDS are here to help you by making sure that others do not get free what you have paid up to £44 for. They are all volunteers and they have been given instructions to follow. They are on holiday as well as you so please be kind to them! Accept that their security precautions are for you own good — especially at Late Night Extra and Camp Sites.

**AMPLIFICATION** Arena - please use equipment provided. The shape of the auditorium renders other equipment useless. Any queries see the Engineer at the Arena P.A. caravan.

All other events - Bands to provide own equipment. If you need to borrow see Eddie Upton well in advance - don't leave it to the last minute.

HOSTELS If you are staying in a hostel, please report to Primley School on arrival. Guides for overseas teams will be waiting there.

LOST PROPERTY Please hand in any articles found at Festival events to Information. They will be advertised in the Newspaper and if not claimed valuable items will be handed over to the police and the remainder destroyed.

**CHEQUES** Taken in payment only on production of Cheque Card. No cheques cashed. Stewards must see that Cheque Card Number is written on back of cheque as well as name and address.

BUSKING COLLECTIONS All collections made in East Devon during the Festival must go to Festival Funds under the terms of Council and Police permits. Collecting tins are available at Drill Hall Office. Money should be handed in promptly to Office clearly marked WHERE, WHEN and by WHOM. It will then be acknowledged in the Newspaper. Dancers must not busk in the Esplanade during the day except at the extreme ends (Port Royal and opposite Tourist Information Office). Book the time at Drill Hall Office the day before so it can be advertised in the Newspaper. After 7pm the whole of the Esplanade can be used for busking, but please make sure you leave a gangway for pedestrians to pass without stepping onto the road.

#### THE BILL RUTTER STANDING AWARD

Busking has always been an important feature of the Festival and the collections have always formed an important part of our income. In recognition of this and in memory of Bill Rutter, who retired as Director of the Festival in 1979, the Award will be presented annually to the team or performer who collects the highest amount from busking at Sidmouth during the Festival. All monies must be handed in to the Drill Hall Office by 11pm on Thursday 6th August to qualify. The Award will be presented at Late Night Extra on Friday 7th August.

Get sender to put their home address on the outside of the envelope. If you belong to a team mark name of team on envelope as well. Unaddressed envelopes which are not collected will be destroyed.

TORCHLIGHT PROCESSION The procession is limited to costumed performers only.

English teams please bring your own torches. You need:

Stick 2-3 feet long
Two 'Zip' firelighters
Aluminium kitchen foil
(one roll makes 15-20
torches)
Sellotape or masking tape.

Method: Place two firelighters side by side and wrap in a piece of foil about 6" x 15" so that only the tops show. Then wrap the foil round the end of the stick so that the stick is about halfway up the firelighters. Crush the foil around the top of the stick to prevent it from burning. Tape round stick and firelighters securely. Some plastic tapes stretch when hot. BEWARE!
