The Stores


This shop served the people of Bampton for over 200 years

From early in the 19th Century, until the turn of the 20th Century, it was Holloways Printers, locally known as the Bampton Stamp Office

Early in the 20th Century it became a village shop, selling groceries, sweets, tobacco and in later years, pet supplies

It was looked after by a succession of shopkeepers until its closure in 2010

Adrian John Simmonds

June 13th 1940 – February 20th 2014

Adrian was an only child who always had confidence. A cousin, Bob Langley, gave the eulogy at Adrian's funeral and Bob was one of eleven. Adrian wished he had brothers and sisters and Bob wished he didn't.

Adrian was good at cards and enjoyed playing his cousins and uncle and usually did very well from it financially.

He loved playing in his skiffle band.

When he came to Bampton he really fell in love with it and he felt blessed having June and Iris to help him with the shop along with invaluable help from Mike Smee. He was very good at getting others to help him in his various schemes. He always 'had a plan.'

Adrian loved taking photographs and documented many things in Bampton including the removal of the garage from the Market Square to be replaced by Thornberry Flats and he indulged his interest in steam engines photographing Tim Tomlins' work to restore the Lord Nelson. He also used his photograph to document the things he loved, his village, his people and his countryside.

He was very fond of his snuff and managed to bring back ample supplies from across the English Channel. When he was sitting up in bed waiting to have his first heart surgery, a nurse caught him taking snuff and she asked if it was medicine. He said it was and nothing more was said.

Adrian's greatest fear was ending up in an 'old folks' home'. He didn't.

Cousin Bob and his wife will look after his beloved boxer dog Albie for the rest of his life, which sadly won't be all that long as he's 10 years old.

There were many of Adrian's photographs around the church for his funeral and a boxful in the Romany for people to enjoy, and they were enjoyed by all who went to the Inn.

He will be missed very much by many people. Adrian employed many young people who had a Saturday job with him, which gave them a wonderful introduction to the world of work and working with the public. Iris and June worked in the shop before Adrian came to Bampton and stayed with him right up to the day he had to finally close his shop for good.
