Enclosed you will see a sketch in larger detail than the coin, both sides being very clear except for the

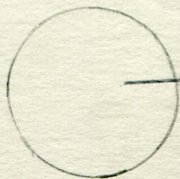
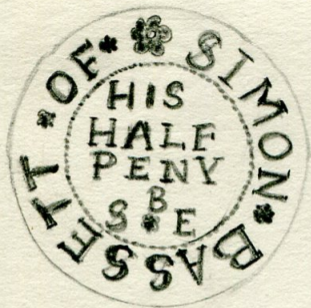
last figure of the date 166?
