A Needle (though it be but small and slender) Yet it is both a maker and a mender: A grave Reformer of old Rents decayd,

Stops holes and seames and desperate cuts displayd,

And thus without the Needle we may see We should without our Bibs and Biggins bee; No shirts or Smockes, our nakednesse to hide,

No garments gay, to make us magnifide: No shadowes, Shapparoones, Caules, Bands, Ruffs, Kuffs,

No Kerchiefes, Quoyfes, Chin-clouts, or Marry-Muffes,

No cros-cloathes, Aprons, Hand-kerchiefes, or Falls,

No Table-cloathes, for Parlours or for Halls, No Sheetes, no Towels, Napkins, Pillow-beares, Nor any Garment man or woman weares.

- 1. PICTURE 1570. Elizabethan silk and gold thread embroidered panel on fine linen. Flowers, insects, birds and fruits. Anonymous loan.
- 2. PICTURE 1630. Silk and metallic bullion thread embroidered panel on linen scrim. Stylised tree, lion and unicorn; bird and shield. Initials ST. Anonymous loan.
- 3. PICTURE 1630. Fine petit point silk panel with figures of shepherd and dog amid stylised flowers and insects. Initials MN. Personal loan.
- 4. SAMPLER 1640. Silk and metal thread on linen.
 Various stitches. Hollie point and maltese cross,
 and interlacing. Property of Oxfordshire County
 Museum Services.
- 5. STUMPWORK PANEL 1645. Charles I silk work panel with central motif of three figures probably of Old Testament derivation. The raised leaves and flowers and silk embroidered birds of outstanding quality and interest. Personal loan.
- 6. FOUR POSTER BED PELMET Mid 17th C. Silk and metal thread embroidery; originally embroidered on silk with hessian backing. Private loan.

- 7. SPOT SAMPLER circa 1650. Worked in silks and silver thread on linen scrim in a variety of stitches and patterns. Property of Scaramanga Antiques, Witney.
- 8. PICTURE 1650. Silk flowers on couched wool background. (Fragment). Probably French. Private collection.
- 9. <u>SAMPLER</u> 1660. Hollie point centre, surrounded by assembled panels of open thread work. Private collection.
- 10. STUMPWORK PANEL 1662. Panel worked by Lady Salter wife of Sir William Salter of "Riskins", Buckinghamshire in 1662 depicting King Charles II and Queen Catherine of Braganza. Infanta of Portugal with associated animals, lion and unicorn, leopard and deer, with rising sun. Also various insects, birds, etc. Worked in silk with seed pearls, coral beads etc. and mounted with a metal thread border probably of a later date. Personal loan.
- 11. <u>BED HANGING</u> 1670. Scalloped bed hanging. Silk on hessian backing, metal thread, braid and edging. Private loan.
- 12. PICTURE 1670. Fragment embroidery silk long and short stitch and silver and gold thread. Figure of a Queen amid floral bocage. Personal loan.
- 13. BED HANGING 1680. Fragment of bed hanging couched gold thread and green silk on linen. English. Private loan.
- 14. CHAIR 1680. Carolean walnut carver chair. Upholstered seat and back. Gros point and petit point embroidery. Circa 1750. Restored by Textile Conservation Centre, Hampton Court Palace. Trust House Forte plc.

- 15. MIRROR FRAME 1690. Small mounted wall hung mirror, the padded and silk covered frame embroidered in long and short stitch in silk and couched bullion thread. Personal loan.
