Artists put their skills on display

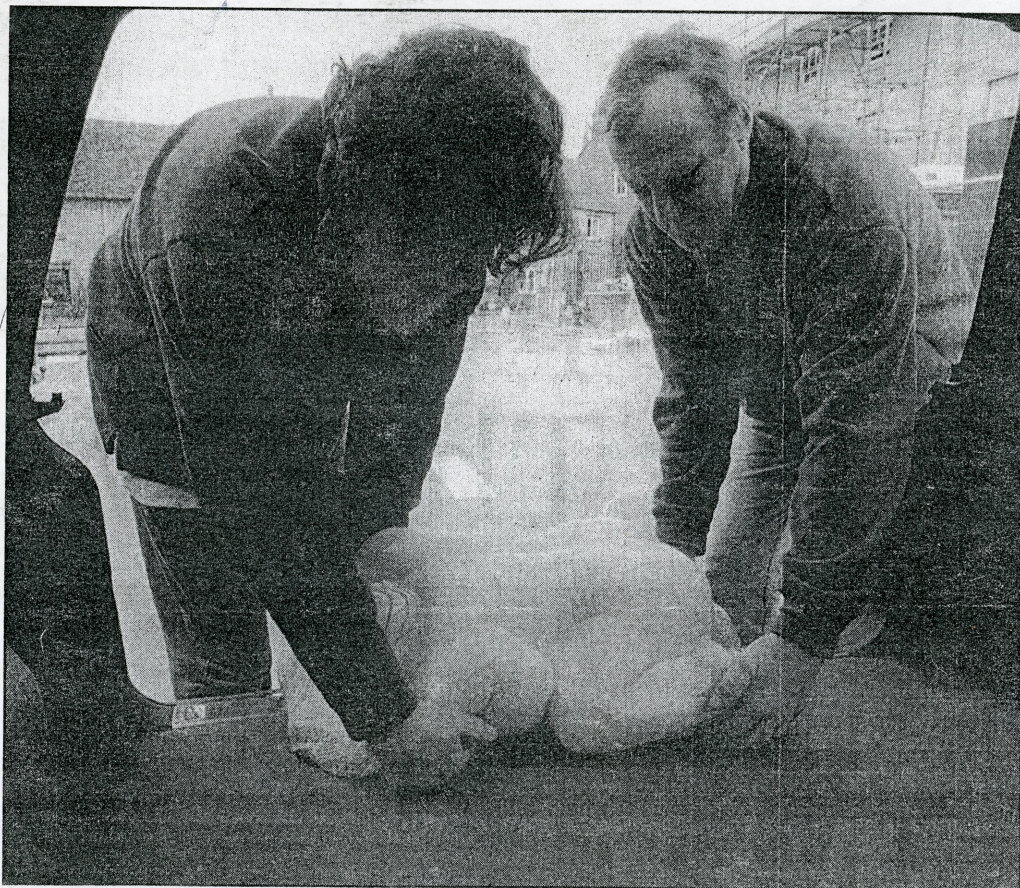
VISITORS to Bampton Town Hall will see the work of four artists on display.
