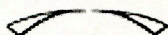
To the Inhabitants of Wateringbury and District:—

Ernest, by Divine permission, LORD BISHOP OF WORCESTER,
and Principal Official of his Consistory Court there lawfully
appointed, To all Clerks and Literate Persons in and
throughout the whole Diocese of Worcester, Greeting:—

Whereas a Petition has been presented unto Us praying that a Faculty
may be granted, ~~authorizing~~ for placing on the South wall of the
Transopt in the Parish Church of Badsey in the County and
Diocese of Worcester, a Tablet constructed of Brass, in
accordance with the design annexed to the said Petition, to
the memory of Arthur Herbert Savory, with the following
inscription thereon (which has been approved by us) :-

"In most loving memory of Arthur Herbert Savory.

Resident at Aldington Manor for 28 years. As Churchwarden
he greatly aided in the restoration of this Church in 1885 and
was a constant worshipper near this spot. He died at Burley,
Hampshire, 17th. July 1921, and was there laid to rest" *****

Now therefore **We** the Vicar General aforesaid do hereby require you
(by publicly affixing this original Notice on the principal outer door of the said Church
prior to and during Divine Service on the Sunday next immediately following the
receipt hereof, and by subsequently leaving affixed on the said door in lieu of the said
original Notice a true copy thereof) to cite, or cause to be cited, all persons having,
or pretending to have, any interest in the premises to enter a Caveat or Appearance
in the Registry of the said Consistory Court, situate in College Street, in the City of
Worcester, within fifteen days after service hereof, and to show good and sufficient
cause why a Licence or Faculty should not issue for the purpose aforesaid. **And**
We do hereby intimate and give Notice to all whom it may concern that if no such
Caveat or Appearance be entered, or no sufficient cause be thereon shewn, a Licence
or Faculty will be issued for the purpose aforesaid.

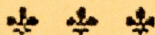
