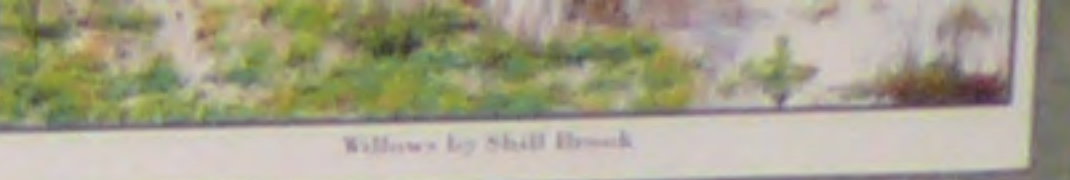

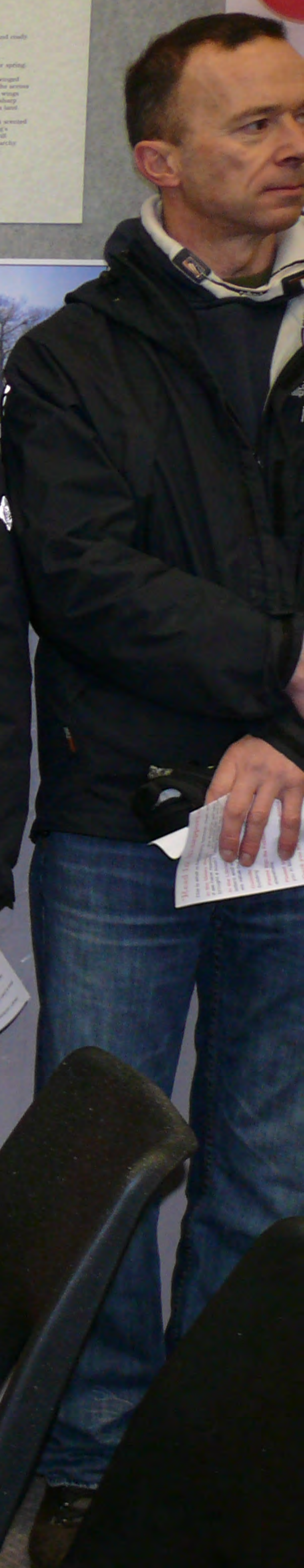
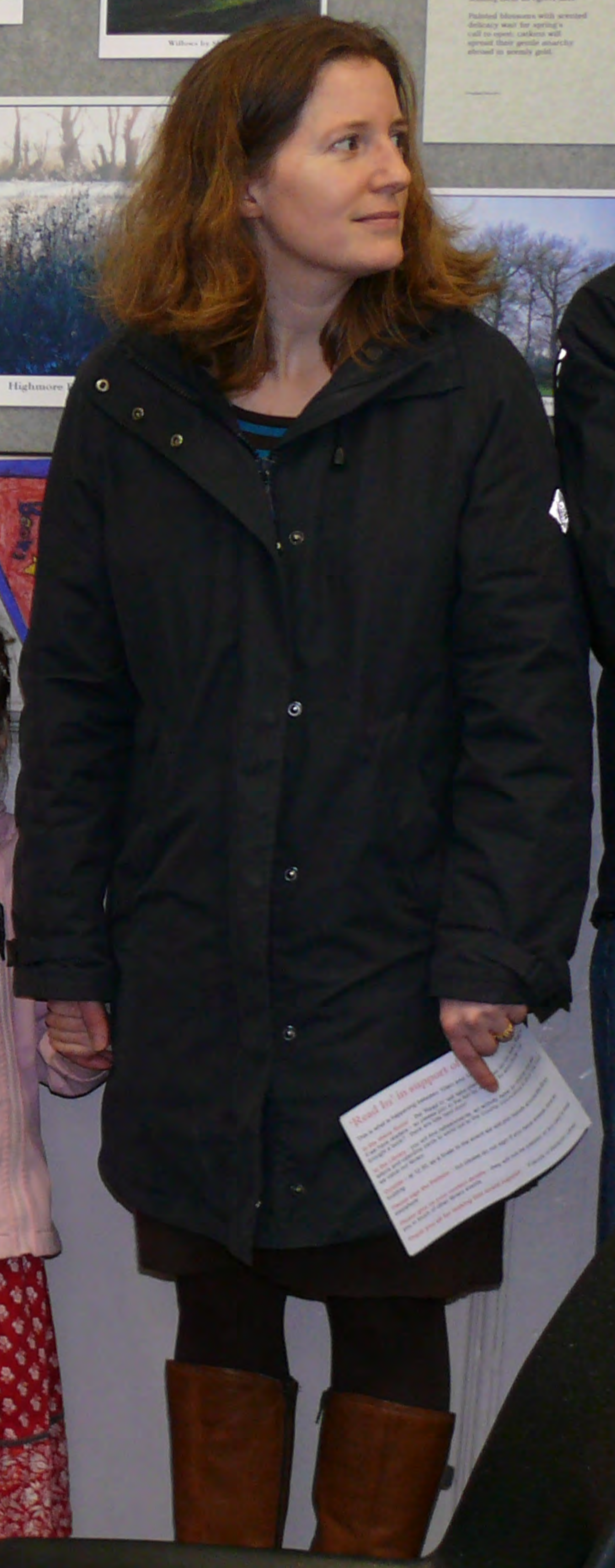
Dear Mr. Bampton

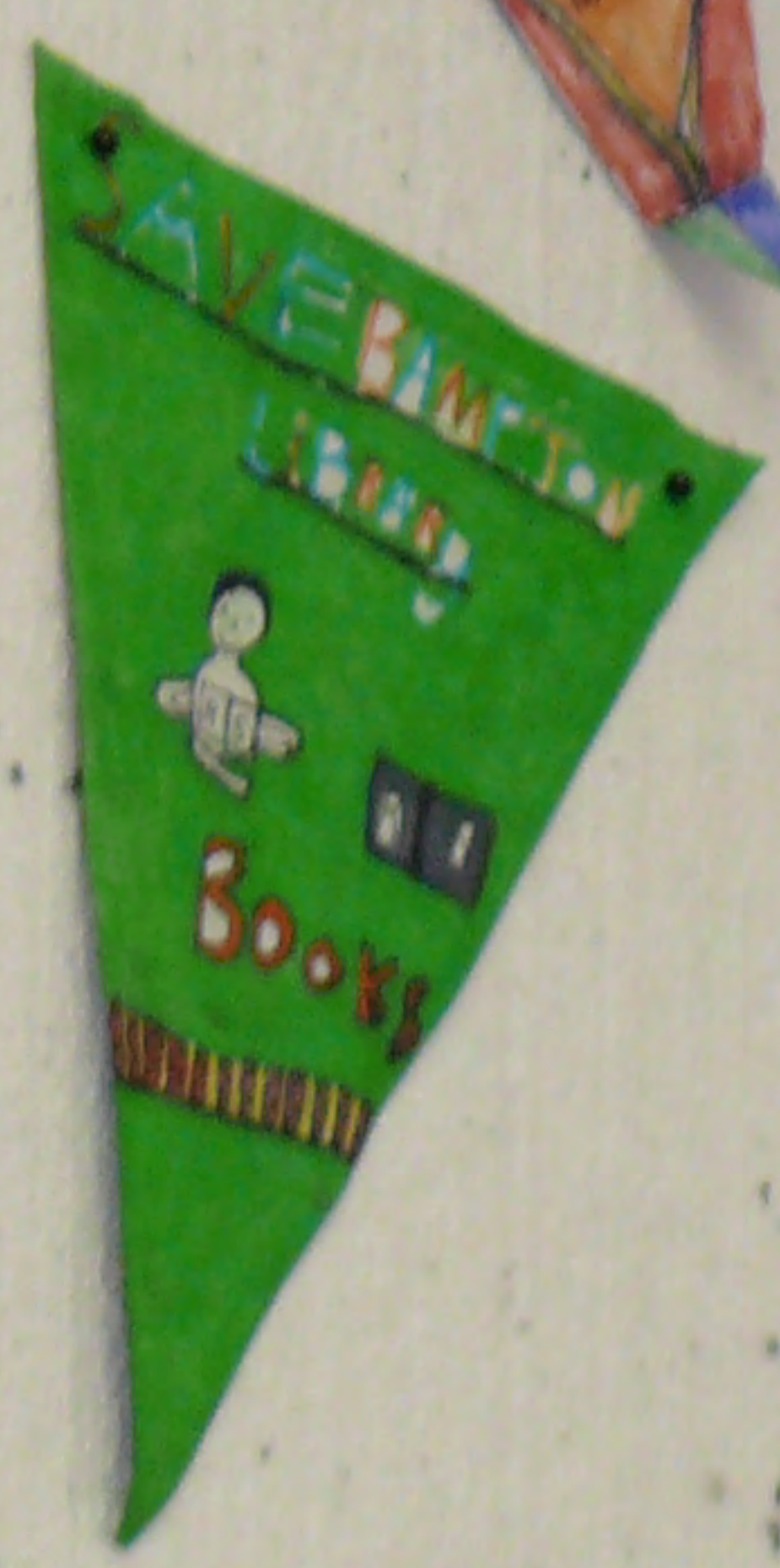

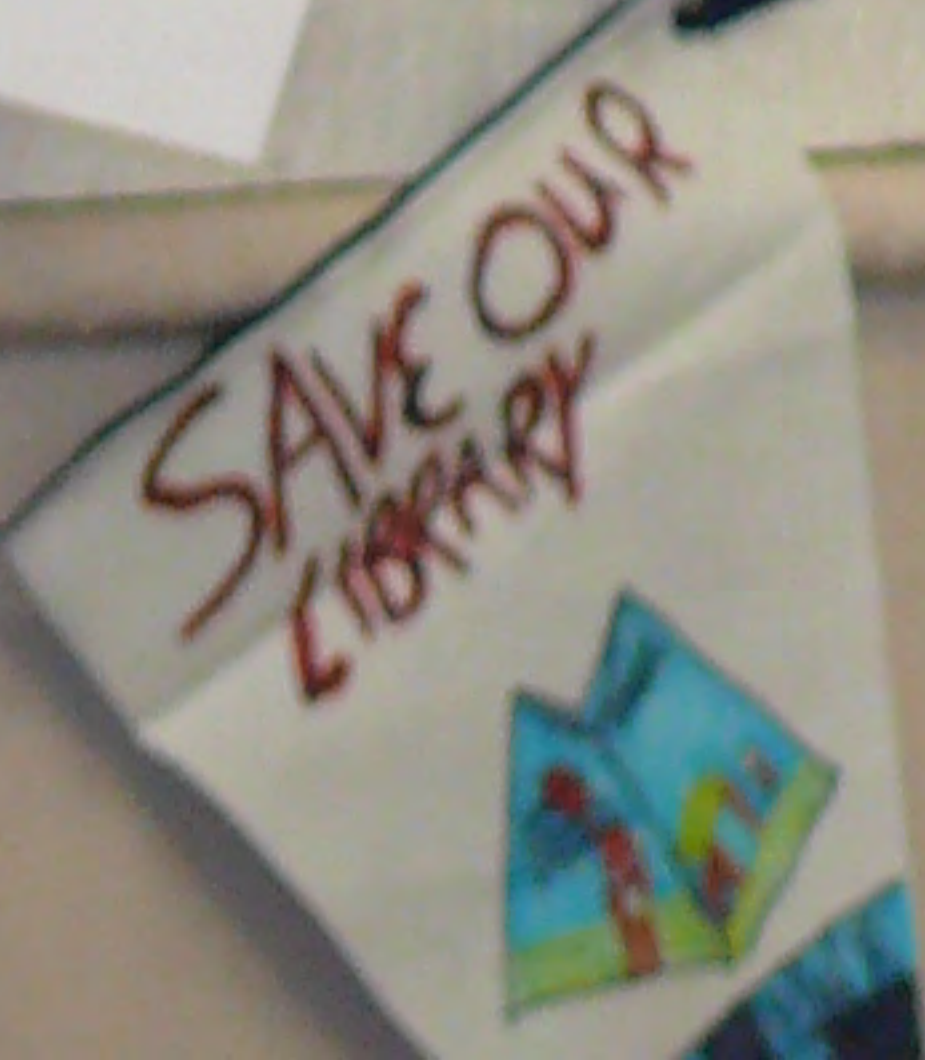

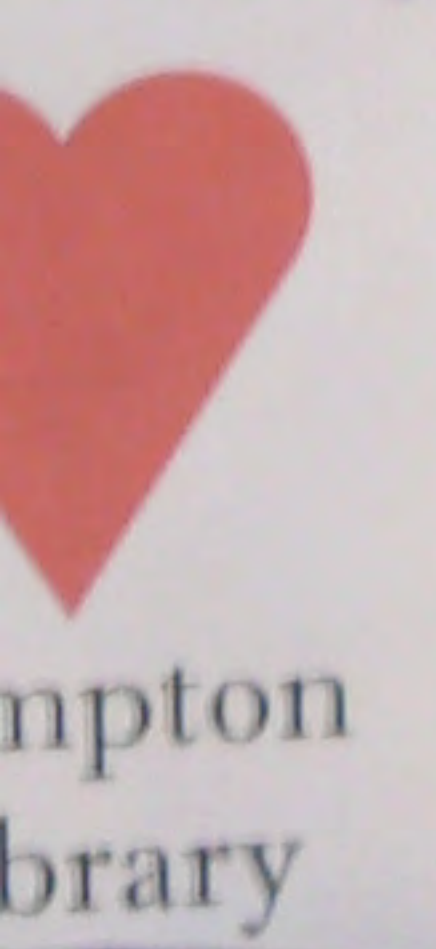
