THE ARTS IN WEST OXFORDSHIRE

LAST WEEK, the West Oxfordshire Arts Association drew the drapes from a splendid forthcoming event to mark a special occasion for them.

On the eve of its seventh birthday, the Association plans to stage an exhibition of 100 of its 250 local artists on the banks of the River Thames at Radcot.

The Open Air Exhibition is planned for Saturday June 14 when it is hoped that summer weather will accentuate the beauty of the paintings and swell the number of visitors.

A tenth of all sales of paintings in the grounds of the Swan Inn, Radcot (landlord Mr. Peter Williams) will be put to the Stoke Mandeville Hospital Appeal. It is suggested that Jimmy Saville O.B.E. may come down for the occasion.

The day will be rounded off by a trip down river in a barge before a members party in the Town Hall Arts Centre in the evening.
